

Marine museum receives grant

Marine Museum of the Great Lakes has received a \$74,300 grant from the Trillium Foundation it plans to use to hire a full-time curator. The grant was announced yesterday. It will subsidize the salary of the curator over a three-year period.

"This will help us raise the standard of our collection's care," Mark Siemons, museum chair, said in a news release. Established in 1974, the Ontario Street museum is the only one in Canada dedicated to the collection, conservation and interpretation of the maritime history of the Great Lakes.
